Tio requirements	<ul> <li>A minimum level of B2 English is required in order to be admitted to study with Tio (equivalent to IELTS 6.0 / TOEFL 80 / CEFR B2). Sending institutions need to make sure that the level of English is sufficient.</li> <li>Tio can only accept exchange students from partner universities, if nominated.</li> <li>Non-EU students need to provide the required documents at least 2.5 months prior to the semester start in order for Tio to complete the visa application.</li> </ul>	
Tio procedure	<ul> <li>Fill out the online application form, which will be sent directly to the student once nominated by the home university.</li> <li>Ensure that you upload the required documents during the application process before the specified deadline.</li> <li>For any questions regarding the application, please contact the International Office (internationaloffice@tio.nl).</li> <li>Upon acceptance at Tio, students will receive information about their allocation to either Amsterdam or Utrecht, as well as details about the start of the academic year.</li> <li>Exchange students must take exams on the regular dates/times, just like all other Tio students. If the semester dates at Tio do not align with your home university timetable, please confirm the possibility of sitting for exams either at Tio or your home university</li> </ul>

#### **VISA Students / Non-EU student**

VISA	Non-EU students need a <b>Residence Permit</b> in order to study with
	Tio. Tio will apply for the residence permit.
	Tio is offering a full service package for Non-EU students. This
	package has one price and includes housing, residence permit, health insurance, service fee of housing and the final deposit.
	Everything you need to be fully prepared for your period abroad!
	Tio needs to comply with the rules and regulations of the Dutch Immigration Department, and therefore offers non-EU students the service package.
	Please note: Students from Canada can also choose for the 'WHP': Working Holiday Permit. This is a special arrangement between the
	Netherlands and Canada, allowing students to study here for a
	cheaper visa price. Besides that students than will be free to choose
	their own housing and insurance. The package fee is not obligatory
	with a WHP. Do note: students need to take care of everything
	(including the visa) themselves.

# Service package fee for Non-EU/Non-EEA students

If you need a visa/residence permit to study at Tio, we will help and guide you through the process. In order to successfully fulfil all the requirements as set by the Dutch immigration department.

The package prices are as follows:

	One semester (5 month)	Two semesters (10 month)
Amsterdam	€ 5,000.00	€ 8,500.00
Utrecht	€ 5,000.00	€ 8,500.00

When staying over during the summer (between two semesters or as an addition to the studies) the 'Summer addition' needs to be booked as well (2months, costs: € 1,700.00).

The package fee includes:

- Housing (actual costs of housing, €650.00 800.00 per month)
- Service fee housing (€ 250.00 450.00)
- Insurance (€ 250.00)
- Visa application
- Residence permit (€ 210.00)
- Deposit (remaining costs)
- Please note: Any leftover deposit will be transferred back to you by the end of the semester.

#### Why do we need you to pay a package fee?

A student can only apply for a residence permit through Tio, due to Dutch visa regulations. The amount of money needs to be transferred to Tio before we can apply for the visa. You will receive an invoice for the total amount once we have received your application and you have been accepted to Tio.
